



## Wheat flakes

### Feed Material

Our wheat flakes are the flattened and broken down kernels of wheat grains. As a 100% natural product, wheat flakes provide a valuable source of carbohydrates, fiber, protein, minerals and vitamins. Carbohydrates are an important source of energy for wild birds, fiber aids digestion and vegetable proteins are essential for muscle development and the well-being of birds. It also contains important vitamins and minerals that make wheat flakes a valuable component of bird feed. This supports a natural and healthy diet for birds and contributes to their vitality. And because they are so soft, they are one of the favorite foods of many garden animals. They are not only suitable as bird food for blackbirds, robins and thrushes, hedgehogs also love to eat them. It is best to scatter the wheat flakes for birds on the ground or on a feeding table close to the ground.

They are even a real delicacy for small rodents such as hamsters.

Wheat flakes are also very easy to digest for chickens. Thanks to the gentle processing of the grains, the coarse structure is retained so that your chickens' urge to peck can be satisfied in the best possible way.

### Recommended feeding:

**Recommendation for wild birds:** Our wheat flakes are suitable for feeding all year round! If you offer the flakes in bird houses or feeders, clean them regularly with hot water. In this way, you minimize the transmission and spread of pathogens. Make sure that the food cannot get soaked even in strong winds, snow and rain, otherwise it will spoil or freeze and the birds will no longer eat it.

Did you know that robins, yellowhammers, dunnocks and blackbirds are so-called ground feeders? They don't like to go to the feeder, but like to pick up the seeds from the ground. If you have space in your garden, provide a ground feeder. Simply fill a wooden or plastic bowl with food and place it on the ground.

If you offer food, please also provide drinking water for the birds. Especially in winter, when natural water sources such as puddles or water in gutters are frozen, birds also need an extra bowl of water. However, there is no need for an expensive bird bath at the bird feeder; a flower pot saucer or an old soup plate are perfect as a watering place. The water should be changed regularly.

**Recommendation for rodents and chickens:** The wheat flakes should be presented fresh daily to rodents and chickens and offered with sufficient fresh drinking water.

**Composition:** 100,0 % Wheat (flaked)

**Analytical constituents and levels:** 12,00 % Crude protein, 1,60 % Raw fat, 2,00 % Crude fibre, 59,40 % Starch
